

Best wishes for the holiday season and health and happiness in the New Year.



Vessel Safety Check Program



Is a Type V Life Preserver right for you and your boating activity?

Type V PFD is a convertible inflatable PFD that is USCG approved only WHEN WORN.

It provides Type II performance when inflated and can be converted to a manual only inflation mode.

All inflatable PFDs require maintenance and are NOT recommended for people who cannot swim.

Inflatable PFDs are NOT for use where water impact is expected as when waterskiing, riding personal watercraft, or when white water paddling.

Safe only if you know it has a full cylinder, know when it is armed and are ready to respond accordingly in an emergency.

NOT for use by children younger than 16 years of age or by persons weighing less than 80 pounds.

You must rearm the PFD after each CO2 use so it will float when needed and to meet USCG requirements.

You Must check the status of the inflator and cylinder BEFORE each outing because experience shows that they're often not loaded when you think they are and premature inflations can go unnoticed.

High humidity and improper storage are two factors that induce premature inflations.

Do not wear inflatable PFD under restrictive clothing because accidental or premature inflation could restrict breathing and injure you.

ADVANTAGES:

Comfortable for continuous wear One of the least bulky of all designs Great flotation when inflated Comfortable for use in hot weather Available in one universal adult size After inflation, floats most wearers face up.

DISADVANTAGES:

In emergencies, you must be prepared to manually or orally inflate if the auto fails to work

Automatic mode is susceptible to premature inflation

Many premature inflations go unnoticed (believe it or not) because CO2 leaks out in several days

Needs proper rearming and maintenance in order to float you

Will not provide flotation with inflation.

Some users may need assistance to properly rearm inflator.

INTENDED USES:

General boating activities by adults Inland waters, or where there is a good chance of a fast rescue and many open/rough water situations

Continuous wear so it's available in an emergency




