"THERE IS NOTHING, ABSOLUTELY NOTHING......"

I accepted a recommendation to lighten up and enjoy my life a bit more. Apparently I was giving the impression to my friends that I was much too serious and needed to change something. So what did I do? I read a classic story entitled The Wind in the Willows by Kenneth Grahame. He introduces wee animals as Mole, Rat, Toad and Badger in a series of comic adventures, well some maybe not so comic, which loosen your imagination and bring a smile to your face. You immerse yourself into their world and experience their concerns; also, I was able to extract myself from the marshes and relate, somewhat, to today's problems of humankind. It was very easy reading. My shoulders lightened.

Boats played an important part in the story. I felt right at home. Out of all came the famous quote, *"There is nothing, absolutely nothing half so much worth doing as simply messing about in boats"*.... I can attest to this; I've messed about in them for decades. Most of my experiences were superbly enlightening, a few were hair raising, some comical. I suspect most of you have had approximately the same amount of experience as I, but grant me the liberty of spewing a few lines. I may have noted some in earlier writings. And, these are a bit different from yours.

My first boat, after the bathtub bunch, was a dory-skiff. It was a lapstreak gem made from marine plywood painted high visibility red. With an ample freeboard I was able to stay dry in the choppiest waters. Moreover it was a safe boat in which I trained my progeny to cruise the southern waters of the Hamptons. It had a flat bottom and drew about one foot. My first time out, after the purchase, I had my dad with me. He was a Navy man, dad was, having served on the USS *New Mexico* between the two World Wars. It was a might foggy and sure enough, I ran the red boat hard aground. With dad! How embarrassing can it get? Then, many years later, I took two neighbors blue fishing.

I watched a distant motor boat cut the corners near an inlet so I followed suit. Have you ever run aground with following seas coming over the transom? My passengers were soaked, and my reputation as an AP dashed. We survived. Come on! You've done this. Anyone with time on the water has buried a keel in sand. Just messing about! The same doryskiff began leaking (probably from too many events as this) and I decided to mess with a trans-bottom repair using fiber glass and resin. I did a fine job which dried as hard as a rock. I slipped the red boat back in the water. Hey, hey, ho, ho. no leaks. The following morning was one of surprises.

The surface of Beaver Dam Creek was as smooth as awell, you know, and the creek water was crystal clean and clear. It all came together as an ecological delight. The reflection of the boat's bottom against the bottom of the creek was a draftsman's delight, an exact replication of the repair job I had done. I was proud of what I saw until I realized I was looking at the trans-bottom repair job resting as one piece on the bottom of Beaver Dam Creek. After messing about for hours, sanding, degreasing, gluing, sanding some more and finishing with coats of resin I now had a transbottom repair job I could fish out of the creek in one piece before chopping it in anger to place in the land fill as an ecological disaster. It just fell off the bottom of the boat. I don't remember what I did to minimize the hurt. I just messed around a bit more, I guess.

I've had plenty more adventures of one kind or another. I remember repairing the bottom of my first sailing vessel (I prefer calling it a vessel rather than a boat; it sounds more distinguished). There was a soft spot in the bilge of Jolly Tar. I removed the spongy wood only to find more behind the scene. I continued to saw and chisel away until the problem was indeed history. But then came another problem, approximately one square meter of boatyard ground was visible through the hole I had created. To make a long story short, I was now in the vessel building business. Messing about in vessels (oh, oh, what have I done?) saved me. I managed to close the gaping wound and lived happily ever after. I even sold the vessel to a great friend who used it for seven years.

I followed with the purchase of a Columbia 45 foot motor sailer, *Explorer I*. I did a lot of messing with that one. In fact, I lived aboard at the *Gangplank Marina* in Washington, D.C. with my lovely spouse for two years. What an educational experience that was. I'll tell you about all that at another time. Anyway, we left D.C. for two years in Saudi Arabia after which I was starved for another sailing vessel (didn't see a one in the desert). Upon my return to the U.S.A. I had to mess again. I bought a Herreshoff catboat, named it *Jolly Tar*; it's been a member of my family for thirty-two years. I'm currently messing with the brightwork. That's my story and I'm sticking to it.Z
