Vessel Safety Check program



The VSE decals for 2020 have arrived. The Squadron Vessel Examiners will be meeting in the near future to make our plans for VSEs at various places in the area. Please contact one of our Examiners to schedule a voluntary Vessel Safety Examination for your vessel. We will be happy to complete the inspection wherever your vessel might be; i.e. at your dock, your marina, on your trailer in your driveway, etc. Remember any privately owned vessel can have a VSE to include power, sail, dinghy, canoe, kayak, and paddle boards. They all count for the individual Examiner as well as the Squadron.

Sometimes people decline to have a VSE because they know their flares are expired, or some other reason, and they don't want to "fail" their inspection. Personal information on a vessel that does not pass is not reported anywhere, but it does count as a legitimate VSE for us.

When the follow up inspection is done, most Examiners only check the item/s that were deficient in the first inspection, so the follow up is very brief indeed. The point is, that both inspections add to our count.

Just so everyone knows how this procedure works, the name of the person who owns the vessel does not go beyond the examiner who does the inspection and the VSE chairperson. The information we pass on to district only includes the type of vessel, date of inspection, HIN, and results of the inspection. None of the information is ever passed to any organization outside of USPS, including law enforcement.

What a current VSE decal can do for you is to satisfy USCG, USCG Auxiliary, NC Fish & Wildlife Enforcement that your vessel meets current safety requirements. In most cases, the agency that may stop you for a safety check will wish you a good day and continue on their way if you have a current sticker. It is to your benefit in many ways to have a current VSE and a 2020 sticker displayed on your vessel.


