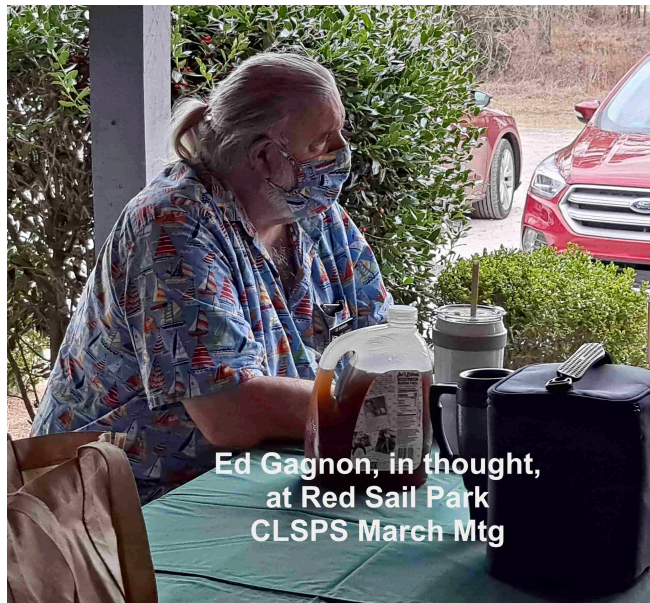

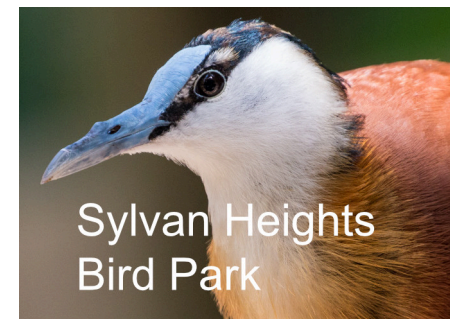

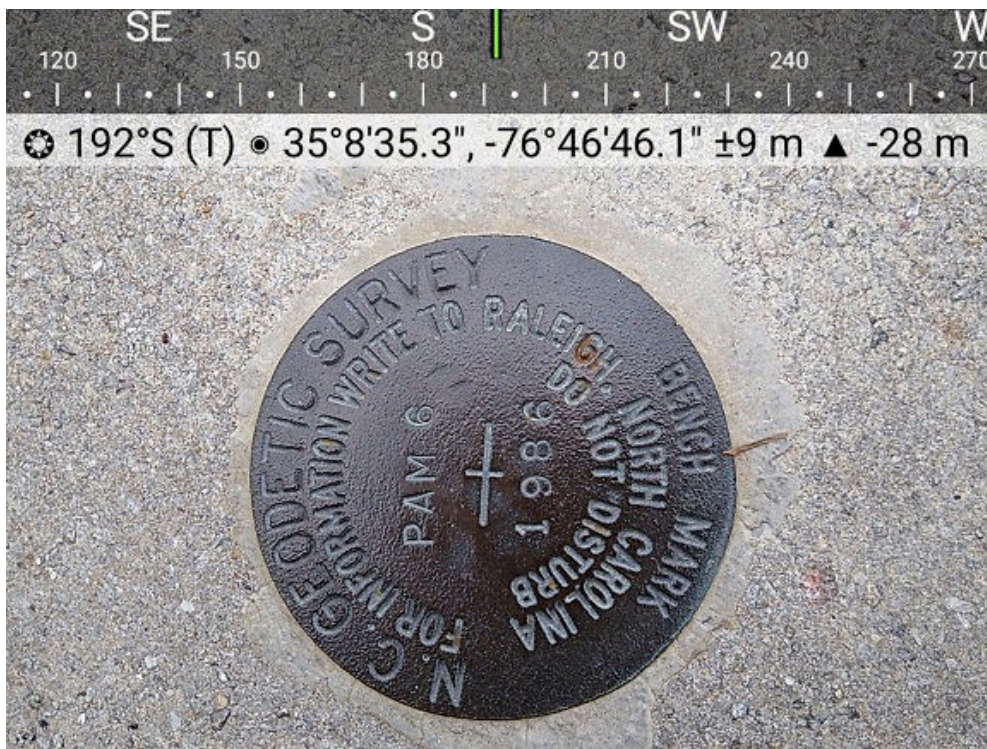

After reading Stf/C Greg Shay's presentation, "The Joy of Geodetics" on the Cooperative Charting Committee web



site at www.usps.org, I decided to get out of the house to see if I could find anything to report.

I found the on-line resources to be easy to use and the electronic tools make it very simple. The web-based maps show in detail where to look for markers. Now, when I go anywhere, I can look to see if there are any markers I can document along the way. I've been using the Solocator app on my phone to take a picture that includes latitude, longitude, direction, date and time.

If you want to submit a report as the Primary Observer, you should first be registered at the Cooperative Charting web site. I believe there are some markers

in River Bend that are ready to be found and I plan to go look for them sometime after May 17. If you want to be an Additional Observer, just let me know, then I can include you in a report.

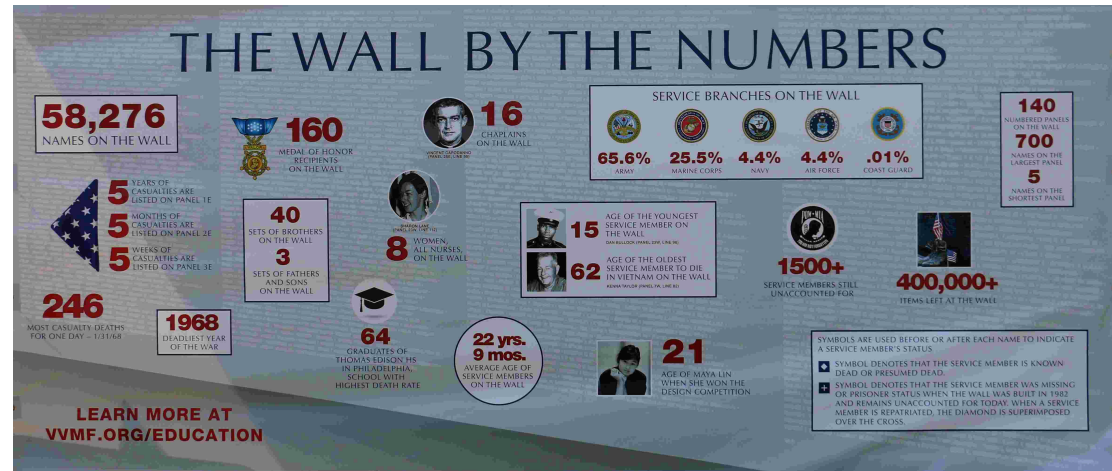
The Wall That Heals

TIME AND NAVIGATION (A BOOK)

I am back from assignment and things are just wacky. Let me explain! I never left on assignment. My e-mails must never have been received by the persons to whom I asked for possible help getting our communities to learn more about our squadron. That's what I'd like to believe. I never got replies. I'll take the blame; I'm big enough to accept a wound or two. I can take it. I'll see those folks sometime in the future.

Well, I'm glad to be back, BUT. I'm trying my hand at putting this document together using g-mail about which I am totally unfamiliar. I cannot find things I used with another system of e-mail. I'll make this short to keep you from suffering at length.

While winding clocks, tapping barometers and trying not to fall over my own feet, I spotted a new book among older ones right in my 'family room', right in my own home. I figured I'd run across a father's day gift, but none of my progeny admits to knowing about it. It's written by Johnston, Connor, Stephens and Ceruzzi, and looks like a book that could be used to introduce the subject of navigation to students just getting started. My initial reaction puts it in the category of a history text, very well illustrated and citing numerous 'things' relating to navigation. Most certainly it will not teach you to use the forms and various methods to navigate. That's for JN and N.

Let me give you a few items of interest, very briefly, which are covered in the text. First, the relationship between time and longitude is explained. Starting at the Greenwich zero, or prime, meridian one has the options of traveling through west or east longitudes for 180 degrees either way.

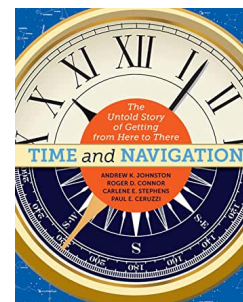
The international date line is where the 180 degrees, either way, meet. That is where time begins. There are twenty four time zones. See if you can pull up Universal time on your radio.

The first nuclear-powered submarine, USS *Nautilus*, cruised beneath the Arctic ice pack and met the true north pole on 3 August 1958. The navigator logged in the time of 1915 U. With 24 time zones meeting at the north pole, what was the time when the submarine was at true north? Careful now!

Amelia Earhart and Fred Noonan disappeared somewhere between New Guinea and the Gilbert Islands in the Pacific Ocean. Something may have gone wrong with their Lockheed 10E. Or maybe they lost track of their position through a fault in their navigational computations. Were they captured by the Japanese?

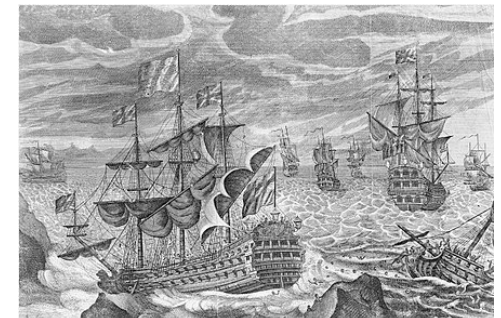
In 1707, the British fleet was returning home from Gibraltar when foul weather made visual navigation impossible. Admiral Shovell, taking advice from his officers, set a course incorrectly, leading to Britain's worst maritime disaster. The fleet crumpled on the rocks of the Scilly Isles at the southwestern tip of England. Four ships and one thousand men plus the admiral were lost because they were not where they thought they were.

John Harrison eventually won prize money for designing a chronometer to tell time at sea. I don't think he ever collected it. Excuse me, what time do you have?

The secret of enjoying good wine---1--Open the bottle and allow it to breath. 2--if it doesn't look like it's breathing, give it mouth to mouth!

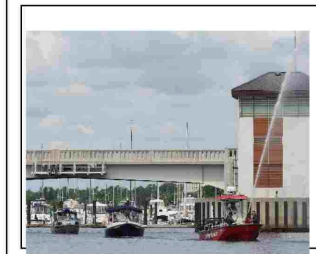


SAVE THE DATE
