




Bob Burget—Latest Geodetic Marker Recovery

I'll be back in North Carolina in late October, looking for people to do some more activities.







BITS AND PIECES HERE IN TRENT WOODS P/C WILLIAM J. ASH, SN, EMERITUS

It was forty-eight degrees Fahrenheit outside the house and seventy-five degrees Fahrenheit outside the bedcovers. I almost froze. The sweltering heat of summer has turned to the cold temperatures of autumn and my peripheral nerves are reacting rather poorly, causing the accompanying muscle masses to fest up and hurt. Twenty-eight plus years of living in Trent Woods, on the edge of New Bern in North Carolina, have turned me into a southern chap having no wish of moving snow ever again. But winter follows with its cold wet rainy days.....and nights. I don't need them. I spent this last Sunday afternoon noting all the little projects still on my list of things to do this past May or June. May I give vou some examples?

First on the list is the submerging of my crab-trap, a professionally built dandy structure guaranteed to provide the user with untold quantities of blue clawed beauties. For whatever reasons, I have missed the opportunities to place odiferous scraps of bait into the trap, then tying a relatively thin length of marine line and settling it off the end of the finger-pier where sleeps the *Jolly Tar*. We take no females. This should have been done months ago. The task still is undone. Here is another mammoth task.

Old, peeling varnish coats the thwarts in the cockpit of the *Jolly Tar*. Also the hatchcover! All the wood is top quality teak. The structures were covered with varnish when I bought the old girl in 1985, and varnish them again and again I did. I should have sanded the wood and coated everything with teak-oil. No, I labored every spring time with scraping, sanding and varnishing. What was I thinking? Now comes the varnish remover, scraping and administration of teak-oil. It's just a simple task, but it still needs doing. Oh yes, it all takes time. More?

Yes, there is more. The top of the centerboard trunk needs a new coat of varnish. The pig-stick needs varnishing. The starboard rub rail needs to be sanded and varnished. The new, post-Florence finger-pier chewed away on it. Simple but awkward job, pier side while in the water. Still needs doing, oh, and here is a corker which is not known to all you power boaters.

The tack of the quadrilateral sail needs to be tied to the mast hoops. There are only six of these hoops, but there is a special way of making the ties. Done the wrong way the ties and hoops will jam and a weakling such as I will

not be able to raise the sail on the appointed day. You think that's funny? I don't. Let's see what else needs attention?

The deck in the cockpit needs scrubbing and repainting. That will take a full shortened daylight day to accomplish, and the days are getting colder. Oh my, I forgot the painting of the cabin top. It will get done with a mellow, catboat sandy color. Okay, so what's the big deal? Just do them Ash, just do them! Yes, just do them! As I become discouraged when progress seems impossible, I call for help from the late Kenneth Graham who wrote the following:

"There is nothing, absolutely nothing, half so much worth doing as simply messing around in boats."

I love 'them, there words' but, Kenneth, have you ever felt like a ninetyone year old scrapper-sander-painter, knot expert with fingers on the lame side? Or like a new ninety-two year old (I will have had a birthday during these encounters) trying to stand on a curved deck tipped fore and aft, with cramping and aching feet trying to tie the sail to the mast-hoops? I'll be lucky to get half of these done before Easter.
